

Orthwein Center prepared Don for his drivers test by creatively challenging his focus and reaction time with unique exercises. Don is known as the "Mayor of Orthwein" for his contagious, positive energy and enthusiasm for the mission. He is a true Paraquad advocate. Don continues working hard to maintain his strength and endurance. Thanks to Paraguad and the Orthwein Center, Don has been able to reclaim more of his independence and his three daughters could not be more proud!

During the time Dee was a full-time caregiver for her parents, she was diagnosed with degenerative spinal stenosis. She found it difficult to complete everyday chores and self-care routines. When Dee came to Paraquad, she was using a wheelchair every day, had not driven in almost a year, and was rarely standing. Her dream is to open her own restaurant, but with her limitations this dream felt out of reach. Dee joined the Orthwein Center and got back on her feet. She was connected to the Reuse Program and started getting around more on her new scooter. She became a student of Bloom Culinary and graduated with her food certifications. Dee is now one step closer to her dream!

Prior to Bettie's ramp installment, she was unable to live at home. Thanks to Paraquad and Home Depot, Bettie can now leave and enter her home at her leisure. "They really put a lot of thought into the design, listened to what I wanted, and executed my vision for the ramp" The ramp has given Bettie the freedom and accessibility to say hello to her neighbors, grocery shop, attend church, and the hair salon!

KJ has been with the Orthwein Center for a little over 2 years, and is an absolute joy! Not only does KJ encourage everyone else around him, he works extremely hard himself. KJ attends the gym at least 2 days a week. Over the last 2 years, KJ has increased his overall endurance and strength. Exercise is vital to individuals living with Cerebral Palsy to help maintain movement. The wheelchair accessible strength and cardio equipment allow KJ to exercise while in his manual or power wheelchair.




